User Manual

Enpass Version– 6.4.0

Welcome to the user manual for Enpass Portable. This manual features detailed guidelines to make you well-acquainted with the app's functionality.

Welcome to Enpass Portable

Unlike traditional Enpass desktop apps, the portable version does not require installation. You can put it on a USB drive and move between computers while taking your app and settings with you. The Enpass portable version has features similar to that of the Enpass Desktop version. Because Enpass runs without installation on the system, it's lightweight and won't leave any footprint on the devices you run it on. Everything, including any settings you've saved, is saved right in the portable app's folder on the USB drive.

Prerequisites

To use the Portable version, all you need is a USB drive and the platform specific Enpass Portable zip file.

- **Windows:** Requires Windows 7 or above.
- **Mac:** Requires macOS 10.11 or later.
- **Linux:** Tested on Ubuntu 14.04 or later ; Fedora 22 or later (only for 64-bit OS).

Who should use Enpass Portable?

If you want to use Enpass on your personal desktops, then you should always use our desktop app. But if you can relate yourself with any of the following conditions, Enpass Portable is for you.

- You are a System administrator and have to keep switching workstations.
- You are not able to install Enpass desktop app and need admin rights.
- You travel a lot and need to access your data on some other PC where you can't install the desktop version. Though we don't recommend to plug in your USB in any insecure/unknown system.
- You have to work with multiple Enpass databases.

What's New in 6.4.0

Multiple Vaults

We are excited to have support for more than one vault to collaborate with our family and team members.

Secure Sharing

Every single item that you want to share with others can now be encrypted with a passphrase (call it Pre-Shared Key). You can create PSKs from the Advanced Settings of Enpass after which an additional option to Encrypt with PSK will appear while sharing the item.

Enpass Assistant

The minified Enpass is now called Enpass Assistant (Formerly Helper). It offers excellent autofilling experience with browser extensions, and you can invoke it from a Keyboard shortcut or System Menu bar.

Keyfile Support

Enpass 6 to let you use Enpass-Keyfile in addition to your master password as a second factor required to unlock the Enpass on every platform.

Website icons

Enpass 6 now has website icons for almost all items. You can enable them from Advanced settings in Enpass.

Trash & Archive

You know what to do with Trash. Archive those unwanted items which should be skipped while Searching.

History of Every Field

Like password fields, you can now see the history of changes in every kind of fields in an item except Notes.

OneDrive for Business

You can now sync with OneDrive for Business accounts in Enpass.

Localization


Added localization support for Afrikaans, Malay, Croatian, Hungarian, Indonesian, Romanian, Slovak and Swedish.

Setting up Enpass Portable

Setting up Enpass Portable is more easy than it sounds and doesn't need any special instructions.


For Mac & Windows

- [Download](#) and extract the EnpassPortable, and copy the extracted folder to FAT32 formatted USB drive.
- All done. You can run the platform specific executable file now.



For Linux

- [Download](#) and extract the EnpassPortable.tar.gz (currently available for 64-bit OS only), and copy the extracted folder to EXT4 formatted USB drive.
- All done. Open the folder and run the executable file.



Important

We recommend you to manually take backup of your latest data on your desktop or enable sync to your cloud. Because in case of loss or theft of your USB drive, there would be no other way to recover the data.

For Cross-platfrom Usage


The best thing about Enpass portable is that you can use the Enpass on single USB for all the supported platforms. All you need to do is to follow these simple steps to set your sails-

- Create a shared partition in EXT4 and FAT32 format in the same USB drive. Each partition must be of minimum 200 mb in size.
- Copy the Windows and Mac supported Enpass portable file in the FAT32 formatted partition, and Linux file in the EXT4 formatted partition.
- You're all done here. Simply run the platform specific executable file in the USB drive.

Using Enpass Portable

The best thing about Enpass Portable is you don't need to install it, just copy the files in your USB drive, plug-in and go!


- Run the Enpass Portable file saved in your USB drive. A pop-up will appear asking to choose the location to save/open your Enpass database.




Note

For quick access, you can also save the location of your database for future reference by clicking the *Remember location* check-box.


- Click on Browse and set the location for your database.



- In case you have already saved the location, you will also get an option to choose the database from your recent saved locations.




- Once you've set the location for your Enpass data, you would be provided with a screen where you can set up the Enpass according to your preferences.



- Next time when you'll log into Enpass, it will automatically load previous data (if the location is still accessible) and prompt you to enter the master-password. The location can be changed by clicking the **Choose** button.
